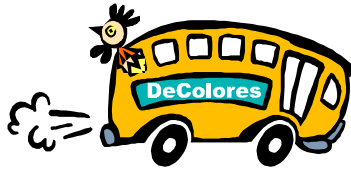

Latvian Call to Service

I wish to share with you some information regarding the Latvian Via de Cristo movement. You may very well be as surprised and yet just as convicted as I was when I came across this article.

While living in Latvia, a Catholic missionary observed that communism robbed men in its former states of their decision-making abilities. Moscow decided everything. If, in the opinion of the government, a man chose "wrong" he could be deported or even shot. Most concluded that it was "safer" to not decide anything. Acquiescence was a way to survive.

Even though their women have learned to fill in the gap, that Latvian men are now historically "indecisive" is a sad legacy with which we are forced to deal every day. As a result, it should be easy to perceive the difficulty in filling a 32 man Via de Cristo team. And worse, one must also take into consideration the natural attrition rate -- it is just expected that a certain percentage will not continue in the Via de Cristo movement.

This year, Aldis Kalcenavs from Brutnieki is the Rector for the Men's Latvia Via de Cristo #3. The date for their weekend is July 8 - 11. *Anda Zikmane from Rujiena is the Rector for the Women's Latvia Via de Cristo #3. The date for their weekend is July 15 - 18.* Aldis and I attended our Indiana Via de Cristo Men's North #34. This began my association with the Latvian Via de Cristo movement.

Of the 17 Latvian men who have turned in applications for this weekend, only 5 have

responded with a definite "yes" to Aldis' invitation to be on team. It is evident that he will need help from our people in the United States. Although several invitations have been sent to men in our InKy Via de Cristo organization, only two have responded.

Let this be a call to Latvia duty for any available Via de Cristo servants. I would ask each of you to prayerfully and willingly approach our Lord Jesus Christ and ask for His will, and His permission, and His supply in this matter. I am praying therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth laborers into His harvest.

Christians are needed to not only to go and help further God's kingdom on Earth, but also to give Latvian men the motivation to make personal decisions in life and find real purpose for themselves through Jesus Christ. Please be assured that You are a needed resource for the success of this Latvian Via de Cristo Weekend.

Even though this has dealt with only Latvian men, our InKy Via de Cristo women are also needed as team members.

Costs? Last year the round trip air to Latvia was about \$1250. At Brutnieki, the food and lodging is inexpensive by any American standards - about \$10 per day. The Via de Cristo weekend attendance fee is \$45. Our Latvian family, using the *share a ride method*, will arrange for our transportation.

Your request for transfer has been denied. I herewith present My reasons:

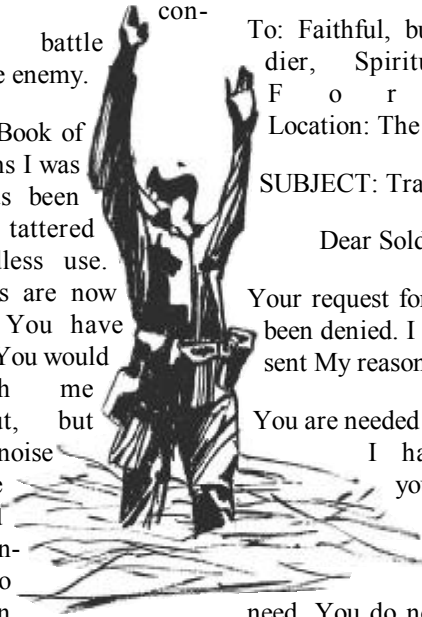
You are needed in this battle. I have selected you, and I will keep My Word to supply your need. You do not need a demotion and transfer. (You'd never cut it on latrine duty.)

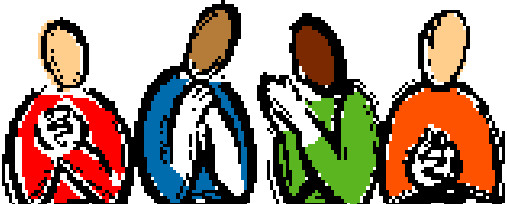
